1. Number of legal persons and entrepreneurs in the Central Registry of Accounts as at 31 January 2021

As at 31 January 2021, there were 76,522 **legal persons and entrepreneurs**¹ on the records of the Central Registry of Accounts. Compared to 31 December 2020, this is an increase of 0.21%.

We underline that the data on the number of legal persons and entrepreneurs in the Central Registry of Accounts are harmonized with the data on operating legal persons and entrepreneurs registered in the Central Registry of Business Entities (CRPS).

Other data published relevant to enforcement collection implementation are updated accordingly.

As at 31 January 2021, the total number of operating **business entities**² as registered in the CRPS and having operating accounts in the Central Registry of Accounts was 50,239 which represents an increase of 0.21% in relation to 31 December 2020.

2. Indicators of enforced collection implementation as at 31 January 2021

As at 31 January 2021, the number of judgement debtors with frozen accounts was 18,978 or 0.70% more than on 31 December 2020. In the total number, the accounts of 15,290 business entities were frozen, which is 0.81% more compared to 31 December 2020.

As at 31 January 2021, in terms of value, total amount of debt based on which the judgement debtors accounts were frozen was 782,978,173.89 euros, which is an increase of 1.52% in relation to 31 December 2020.

In the total amount of debt, business entities accounted for 757,045,244.24 euros or 1.55% more than as at 31 December 2020.

¹ The term “legal persons and entrepreneurs” includes: business entities and entrepreneurs; NGOs; foundations; associations; public enforcement officer; notaries; the Ministry of Finance as the authority competent for receiving, payment and transfer of the government money; local self-government authorities, etc.

² Pursuant to the Law on Business Organizations, the forms of organization pursuing economic activities are business organizations and other forms determined by the Law: individual entrepreneur; general partnership (“GP”); limited partnership (“LP”); joint stock company (“JSC”), limited liability company (“LLC”); foreign company branch. In this report, all the above mentioned forms are referred to as business entities.

It should be highlighted that, debt concentration was relatively high as at the reporting date so, for example, 10 largest blocked business entities, i.e. 0.05% of the total number of registered debtors, accounted for 22.08% of the total frozen amount, which means that their frozen funds totalled 172,857,104.90 euros.

Fifty largest blocked business entities, which make up 0.26% of the total number of registered debtors, accounted for 42.13% of the total frozen amount, which means that their frozen amount stood at 329,900,216.91 euros.

3. Enforced collection duration as at 31 January 2021

As at 31 January 2021, a total of 1,742 judgement debtors were under uninterrupted blockage up to one year with the frozen amount of 94,466,713.64 euros, making up 12.06% of the total frozen amount, whereas a total of 17,236 judgement debtors were under blockage for over one year, with the frozen amount of 688,511,460.25 euros, accounting for 87.93% of the total frozen amount.
