

Enforced collection indicators

1. Number of legal persons and entrepreneurs in the Central Registry of Accounts as at 28 February 2022

As at 28 February 2022, there were 82,637 **legal persons and entrepreneurs**¹ on the records of the Central Registry of Accounts. Compared to 31 January 2022, this is an increase of 0.46%.

We underline that the data on the number of legal persons and entrepreneurs in the Central Registry of Accounts are harmonized with the data on operating legal persons and entrepreneurs registered in the Central Registry of Business Entities (CRBE).

Other data published relevant to enforcement collection implementation are updated accordingly.

As at 28 February 2022, the total number of operating **business entities**² as registered in the CRBE and having operating accounts in the Central Registry of Accounts was 52,948 which represents an increase of 0.39% in relation to 31 January 2022.

2. Indicators of enforced collection implementation as at 28 February 2022

As at 28 February 2022, the number of judgement debtors with frozen accounts was 19,493 or 0.05% less than on 31 January 2022. In the total number, the accounts of 15,749 business entities were frozen, which is 0.04% less compared to 31 January 2022.

As at 28 February 2022, in terms of value, total amount of debt based on which the judgement debtors accounts were frozen was 908,772,782.94 euros, which represent an increase of 1.13% in relation to 31 January 2022.

In the total amount of debt, business entities accounted for 881,296,258.28 euros or 1.16% more than as at 31 January 2022.

¹ The term “legal persons and entrepreneurs” includes: business entities and entrepreneurs; NGOs; foundations; associations; public enforcement officer; notaries; the Ministry of Finance as the authority competent for receiving, payment and transfer of the government money; local self-government authorities, etc.

² Pursuant to the Law on Business Organizations, the forms of organization pursuing economic activities are business organizations and other forms determined by the Law: individual entrepreneur; general partnership (“GP”); limited partnership (“LP”); joint stock company (“JSC”), limited liability company (“LLC”); foreign company branch. In this report, all the above mentioned forms are referred to as business entities.

It should be highlighted that, debt concentration was relatively high as at the reporting date so, for example, 10 largest blocked business entities, i.e. 0.05% of the total number of registered debtors, accounted for 23.75% of the total frozen amount, which means that their frozen funds totaled 215,852,468.79 euros.

Fifty largest blocked business entities, which make up 0.26% of the total number of registered debtors, accounted for 44.66% of the total frozen amount, which means that their frozen amount stood at 405,907,353.66 euros.

3. Enforced collection duration as at 28 February 2022

As at 28 February 2022, a total of 1,738 judgement debtors were under uninterrupted blockage up to one year with the frozen amount of 29,369,810.18 euros, making up 3.23% of the total frozen amount, whereas a total of 17,755 judgement debtors were under blockage for over one year, with the frozen amount of 879,402,972.76 euros, accounting for 96.77% of the total frozen amount.
